

DID YOU KNOW...

LINCOLN COUNTY'S population is approximately **70,000**. The County's rural setting is ideal for raising a family. Consequently, our county is experiencing faster growth in the East Lincoln area around Lake Norman.

LINCOLN COUNTY operates a State Approved Subtitle D Landfill on approximately 300+ acres with a life expectancy of 25+ years. **46,691** tons of trash, and recycling was weighed into the landfill in 2010-2011, an average of **150** tons a day.

A total of **23,345** tons or **50%** of this waste is diverted from the MSW section of the County Landfill yearly.

Presently, seven (7) convenience sites are located throughout the County, as well as one (1) at the entrance to the landfill.

**LINCOLN COUNTY
LANDFILL...**

LINCOLN COUNTY Landfill is divided into designated areas for materials that must be separated and/or recycled.

Construction & Demolition Debris area accepts, insulation materials, sheet rock, carpet, padding and concrete, painted wood, asphalt, bricks, rocks, gravel and glass. This material must be **inert** and should not cause ground water contamination. Our new C&D area has been in use since July 2003.

White Goods (appliances) are stored in a separate area. We remove the Freon and take White Goods to scrap mill.

Tires must be off the rims and are stored in a separate area. A private company is contracted to collect these tires whenever needed. Tires are placed in a monofil for future reuse as technology improves.

Yard Waste area accepts brush, limbs and pallets. This material is ground and stockpiled and whenever we accumulate a large amount, **we have Free Mulch Giveaways to all Lincoln County residents, until it is all gone.**

Pallets – now have a separate designated area they are ground in.

Electronics –The Landfill and all convenience sites now have containers for electronics. A private company collects these and then recycled.

WHAT'S NEW...

October 1 , 2009 – NCDENR banned 3 additional items from the Landfill: Pallets, Oil Filters, Plastics 1-7. The followings items have already been banned: **Used Oil, Scrap Tires, Yard Trash, Lead Acid Batteries, ABC Beverage Containers, Antifreeze, Cans (steel & aluminum), Oyster Shells, & Whitegoods(appliances). No Liquids (ex. Paint)**

January 1, 2011 – NCDENR banned electronics from the Landfill: Computers, Monitors and Televisions.

LINCOLN COUNTY Solid Waste Dept. is continually looking for ways to better handle your trash and your recyclables. All ground water testing and leachate water testing is sampled regularly.

Lincoln County Solid Waste Dept. continues to increase its recycling program. Our Corrugated Cardboard program is still growing we collected **857** tons this year. We encourage businesses to separate their OCC and bring it to the landfill shop, **free of charge.** Our employees bale it. Residents may drop recycling off at any site. Used motor oil is also recycled at these sites. Antifreeze may be brought directly to the landfill shop.

Our **Solid Waste and Recycling Program** has expanded services to keep up with the growing population in Lincoln County. We are continually improving our handling and hauling strategies to better serve the residents of **Lincoln County.**
